Pre-requisite: A Passing grade in Math 49B (with a grade of C or better) or a satisfactory score on the Calculus Readiness Test.

Attendance: Regular, punctual attendance at **all** class meetings is expected of each student. Students will be responsible for material missed. Homework: Homework will be assigned daily. Homework questions will be discussed/answered during the first 10 minutes of class. **Do not fall behind!** Complete all homework assignments and ask questions.

Assignments: There will be three assignments during the course of the quarter, worth 20 - 25 points each. They will be collected and graded. These can be worked on in groups of up to 3 people, outside of class. **Late Assignments will not be accepted. Do not ask.**

Project: There will be one project assigned during the course of the quarter. This will be worked on outside of class, in groups of 3-4 people. **Late Projects will not be accepted. Do not ask.**

Quizzes: There will be seven unannounced quizzes during the course, worth 10 points each. The lowest quiz score will be dropped. **Missed quizzes cannot be made up for any reason. Do not ask.**

Exams: Three exams will be given, worth 75 points each. Your lowest exam score will be dropped. Exam dates are on the calendar. **No make-up exams will be given for any reason. Do not ask.**

Final Exam: There will be a 2-hour final exam worth 100 points. The exam is comprehensive. Students who miss the final exam without contacting the instructor by the day of the exam will receive a grade of F. **No incompletes will be given for missing the final exam.** The final exam date is on the calendar.
