There are only two ADT-specific changes from our current AA/AS course pass along /substitution practice.

- 1) Substitute/accept courses that are part of another CCC's ADT where deemed reasonable without a student petition. The example provided showed a list of City College of San Francisco's economics courses not offered by De Anza. Please consider:
 - The intent of the ADT is to streamline transfer to CSU, using CSU approved coursework for the specified major, and to minimize repeats or additional coursework based solely on local CCC/CSU requirements.
 - De Anza's Economic of Public Issues and Behavioral Economics courses are very unique among CCCs and we would want other colleges to accept these courses towards their Economic ADT.
 - Students awarded the ADT would receive at least a .1 GPA bump towards transfer into a similar major. (a .3 GPA bump for San Jose State)
- 2) Addition of an ADT /Transfer Center counselor review in the petition process. Coursework applied to each ADT awarded will be reviewed by CSU campuses once our students matriculate, so having someone well versed in ADT regulations and CSU transfer requirements be a part of the student petition process should be beneficial to Department Chairs and Division Deans.
