Faculty Assn (union) members got an email that they “are cordially invited to run for a seat on the Executive Council of the Faculty Association, the exclusive bargaining agent for all District faculty. The Council has openings for three full-time faculty at Foothill, three at De Anza, and two District part-time faculty. All FA members vote for both full- and part-time candidates, but full-time are elected by campus, while part-time are chosen by District-wide vote.

Candidates are required to submit a brief campaign statement via email to elwellsusanne@fhda.edu. The statement should be between 150 and 250 words in length. **Statements longer than 250 words will be subject to editing.** The application and campaign statement are due by noon on May 19, and elections are scheduled for June 13 and 14. A copy of the campaigning policy is attached to this email.

By law, the Executive Council has the authority to govern all proceedings of the Faculty Association: it sets policy, directs the executive staff and standing committees, oversees the development of the *Agreement*(contract), and serves as the voice of the faculty on bargaining and related issues (See Article IV of the *FA Constitution*.)

Members of the Council assume office in the fall and serve a two-year term. They attend two monthly meetings held on the 1st and 3rd Wednesdays of each month from 3-5:30 p.m. (The *Agreement* requires divisions to adjust teaching schedules so that members can attend these meetings.) In addition, Council members attend an annual retreat, usually held in the winter quarter, and serve as division liaisons.

Members of the Council receive a stipend of \$100 for each Executive Council meeting they attend, and \$25 for each committee report they submit.

¹Minimum Revenue Commitment is equal to the 2017-2018 TCR increased each year by the COLA. In 2025-26 and 2026-27 the Minimum Revenue Commitment is recalculated using the floor - which is equal to the TCR used in the 2024-25 year.

Problem: Hold harmless through 2024-25 meaning that we will get at least as much as the previous year. However, beginning 2025-26 there will be no more COLA given and thus no pocket of money to cover costs increases or salary increases. We are one of 10 or 11 districts in “hold harmless”.

Before any increase after 2024-25 we need to “earn” Total Computational Revenue. Otherwise without an increase in salaries FHDA will not remain competitive in attracting employees. $TCR = SCFF + \text{minimum revenue commitment}$

With this modeling tool it is hoped that the District Enrollment Committee (DEMC) can make strategic decisions such as “How does canceling one class rather than another affect TCR.
