AB 1111 (Berman) Common Course Numbering

The Common Course Numbering (CCN) Task Force has recently released <u>a draft report outlining recommendations for implementing a student-facing common course numbering system</u> across the California Community Colleges, as mandated by AB 1111 (Berman).

This report proposes guidance in key areas like governance, course alignment, technology requirements, and a common taxonomy. Notably, it calls for the development of system-level CCN Descriptors that define required common elements for courses, while still allowing for local expansion and customization.

Faculty are strongly encouraged to review this draft report and provide feedback **prior to the October 18** CCN Task Force meeting. In particular, we encourage you to focus on the proposed governance structure, implementation processes, and taxonomy recommendations. AB 928 Associate Degree for Transfer Intersegmental Implementation Committee

The Associate Degree for Transfer Intersegmental Implementation Committee recently released <u>a draft report outlining</u> <u>findings and considerations to strengthen transfer pathways</u> between California community colleges and four-year institutions. As community college faculty, your feedback on this draft report **would be invaluable during the public comment period open through November 15**.

The report provides data, analysis, and draft goals focused on increasing transfer rates, closing racial equity gaps, modifying STEM degree requirements, and re-engaging students who've earned ADTs but have not transferred. It will inform the committee's final recommendations to the California legislature for improving transfer outcomes.

We encourage you to review the draft report and consider providing comments by November 15 on whether the findings resonate with your on-the-ground experience and if the draft considerations put forth by the committee seem appropriate and feasible.
