Subject: Community Engagement Survey, Spring 2013
The Community Engagement survey was conducted in the spring quarter of 2012 and 2013. The 2013 survey was sent to all enrolled students with a valid, personal email address $(17,279)$ at the end of the quarter (May 15) in order to capture activities students participated in throughout the academic year. This resulted in 1,389 valid responses for a response rate of $8 \%$. The 2012 survey resulted in 1,107 valid responses for a response rate of $5 \%$. The results for each question in the past two surveys resulted in similar outcomes. The composition of the two samples was also similar, allowing for the establishment of a baseline for community engagement moving forward.

Highlights include:

## Since entering De Anza College, have you participated in the following activities?

- $71 \%$ of respondents stated they obtain news regularly (through Internet, television, newspaper, radio, etc) compared to $75 \%$ in 2012.
- $61 \%$ of respondents stated they discussed politics ( $61 \%$ in 2012).
- $48 \%$ of respondents stated they signed a petition, down from $55 \%$ in 2012.
- $12 \%$ of respondents worked on a local, state or national campaign, up from $10 \%$ in 2012.
- $13 \%$ raised money for a campaign, party or group ( $14 \%$ in 2012).


## Since entering De Anza College I have increased my knowledge of:

- $73 \%$ of respondents stated they strongly agree or agree that their knowledge has increased in regards to global issues ( $72 \%$ in 2012).
- $75 \%$ of respondents stated they strongly agree or agree that their knowledge has increased in regards to national issues ( $76 \%$ in 2012).


## Since entering De Anza College I have increased my ability to:

- $89 \%$ of respondents stated they strongly agree or agree that they increased their ability to work with others from diverse backgrounds ( $88 \%$ in 2012).
- $88 \%$ of respondents stated they strongly agree or agree that they increased their ability to understand people from other cultures or ethnicities ( $87 \%$ in 2012).
- $51 \%$ of respondents stated they strongly agree or agree that they increased their ability to have an impact on social or political change (54\% in 2012).


## Since entering De Anza College, I believe more now than I did before that:

- $63 \%$ of respondents stated they strongly agree or agree that they believe more now than before that helping others is personally rewarding ( $63 \%$ in 2012).
- $83 \%$ of respondents stated they strongly agree or agree that they believe more now than before that they have something to offer the world ( $80 \%$ in 2012).
- $76 \%$ of respondents stated they strongly agree or agree that they believe more now than before that they can learn a lot through their involvement in community causes ( $74 \%$ in 2012).
- $63 \%$ of respondents stated they strongly agree or agree that they believe more now than before that they are able to affect social or political change ( $62 \%$ in 2012).


## Political Knowledge

- $33 \%$ of respondents were able to identify that if the President of the United States fails to sign or veto a bill sent to him within 10 days, it automatically becomes law ( $32 \%$ in 2012).
- $59 \%$ of respondents identified that a $2 / 3$ vote is required for the U.S. Senate and House of Representatives to override a presidential veto (59\% in 2012).
- $62 \%$ of respondents identified that the Supreme Court has the responsibility to make the final decision on whether a law is constitutional or not ( $64 \%$ in 2012).


## Comparison of Respondents to 2012 Spring Student Population

Overall, the sample population was comprised of a larger proportion of full-time students, female students, and students who identify as White and a smaller proportion of students between the ages of 20 and 24 years old.

- $52 \%$ of respondents reported they are enrolled full-time, slightly higher than the spring 2013 student population of full-time students (43\%).
- $35 \%$ of respondents identified their ethnicity as Asian, slightly lower than the spring 2013 student population of Asian students at $39 \%$.
- $29 \%$ of respondents identified their ethnicity as White, higher than the spring 2013 student population at $23 \%$.
- $60 \%$ of respondents reported they were female, 12 percentage points higher than the spring 2013 female student population of $48 \%$.
- $23 \%$ of respondents reported they are 19 years old or less, slightly higher than the spring 2013 student population of the same age group (19\%).
- $35 \%$ of respondents reported they were between 20 and 24 years old, lower than the spring 2013 student population of the same age group at $42 \%$.
- $51 \%$ of respondents reported that the estimated income of their parents or guardians while they were in high school was less than $\$ 60,000$.
- $12 \%$ of respondents reported that they worked on campus, while $52 \%$ of respondents reported working off campus. $43 \%$ of respondents reported not working at all.
- $62 \%$ of respondents reported that English was the primary language spoken in their household.
- $40 \%$ of respondents reported that the highest education level of their primary parent or guardian was a Bachelors' Degree or higher. 29\% of respondents reported that the highest education level of their secondary parent or guardian was a Bachelors' Degree or higher.
