Subject: Community Engagement Survey, Spring 2014

The Community Engagement survey was conducted in the spring quarter of 2014. The survey was sent to all enrolled students with a valid, personal email address (17,870) at the end of the quarter (May 5) in order to capture activities students participated in throughout the academic year. This resulted in 880 valid responses for a response rate of 5%. Highlights include:

Prior to entering De Anza College, have you participated in the following activities?

- 81% of respondents obtained news regularly (through internet, television, newspaper, radio, etc.).
- 68% of respondents worked without pay in their community to help others.
- 61% of respondents joined a group or organization.
- 20% of respondents persuaded others to vote for a particular candidate or party.
- 12% of respondents worked on a local, state, or national campaign.

Since entering De Anza College, have you participated in the following activities?

- 79% of respondents obtained news regularly (through internet, television, newspaper, radio, etc.).
- 61% of respondents signed a petition.
- 50% of respondents worked without pay in their community to help others.
- 17% of respondents persuaded others to vote for a particular candidate or party.
- 12% of respondents worked on a local, state, or national campaign.

Since entering De Anza College, I have increased my ability to:

- 75% of respondents stated they strongly agree or agree that they increased their ability to understand people from other cultures, races, or ethnicities.
- 57% of respondents stated they strongly agree or agree that they increased their ability to converse productively about controversial issues with someone whose background or views are different from their own.
- 46% of respondents stated they strongly agree or agree that they increased their ability to voice their opinions on campus, at work, or in their community.

Since entering De Anza College, I believe more now than I did before that:

- 69% of respondents strongly agree or agree that they believe more than they did before that they can be part of something bigger than themselves to effect change.
- 68% of respondents strongly agree or agree that they believe more than they did before that they have the tools to communicate with someone whose views are different from their own.
- 19% of respondents strongly agree or agree that they believe more than they did before that they are just one person and their actions cannot change our government or social system.

I see myself:

- 89% of respondents strongly agree or agree with the statement that they see themselves as someone who values helping others.
- 79% of respondents strongly agree or agree with the statement that they see themselves as someone who has something to offer the world.
- 48% of respondents strongly agree or agree with the statement that they see themselves as part of the campus community.
- 39% of respondents strongly agree or agree with the statement that they see themselves as an individual with limited impact on what happens in this country.

I believe that after leaving this college, I will:

- 81% of respondents strongly agree or agree that they believe they will help others who may not be as well off as themselves.
- 73% of respondents strongly agree or agree that they believe they will be an integral part of society.
- 54% of respondents strongly agree or agree that they believe they will work with others to promote social or political change.

Since entering De Anza College, I have increased my knowledge of:

- 65% of respondents stated they strongly agree or agree that their knowledge has increased in regards to global issues.
- 65% of respondents stated they strongly agree or agree that their knowledge has increased in regards to national issues.

Political Knowledge

- 60% of respondents identified that the Supreme Court has the responsibility to make the final decision on whether a law is constitutional or not.
- 55% of respondents identified that Tuesday is the day of the week that local, state, and federal elections are held.
- 79% of respondents identified that the city council functions the most like the legislative branch in local government.
