
De Anza College Office of Institutional Research and Planning Exploring Federal Grants – Data Points for Consideration

The graphic below displays the top enrolled course in each of the 10 divisions across the campus. The bubbles represent the success rate of each racial/ethnic group in the course in 2018-19. As displayed in the graphic below, African American/Black student populations are consistently at the lower half of the success rates followed by Pacific Islander and Latinx students. South East Asian students are largely above average and grouped closer to White and Asian, Other than Filipinx or Pacific Islander students.

There are exceptions that could help provide examples of how we as a college work towards closing equity gaps. For example, students in ESCI1 all have success rates above 70% (sample sizes are included below) with the largest gap for African American students, but small gaps for all other student groups.

Success rates only tell part of the story. Other indicators to explore by race/ethnicity include:

- Access to the college
- Access and enrollment in a particular course
- Participation by major
- Academic probation rates
- Enrollment in higher level math and science courses

- Withdraw rates
- Placement into transfer level courses with and without corequisite support
- Faculty effects on success rates
- Faculty and staff diversity
- Degree, certificate, and transfer rates
- And, so much more!
