Subject: Child Development Survey Results, Spring 2016

#### Important highlights include:

- 71% (109) of students responded transfer/A.A or A.S. Degree when asked what their educational goal was, while 19% (29) responded certificate/train for new career. (Question 4)
- 69% (106) of students responded English is their language preference when reading new material or hearing a lecture, while 10% (15) responded Cantonese/Mandarin. (Question 7)
- 59% (88) of students responded they would attend classes if offered between 9:00 a.m. and noon, 42% (62) responded between noon and 3:00 p.m., 39% (58) responded between 4:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m., 29% (43) responded between 7:30 a.m. and 9:00 a.m., 28% (42) responded Saturday classes and 21% (31) responded Friday evenings. (Question 10)
- 33% (50) of students responded that they are employed currently as a teacher/aide or assistant teacher, while 54% (82) responded they are not working at this time/employed but not in Child Development related work. (Question 11)
- 54% (81) of students responded that work and/or family obligations or English as their second language was their biggest challenge to their success in classes, while 15% (23) responded they did not have any challenges. Compared to the Spring 2015 survey where 57% (112) of respondents felt that work and/or family obligations or English as their second language was their biggest challenge to their success in classes, while 11% (22) of respondents did not have any challenges. (Question 20)
- 68% (102) of students responded that they first heard about the Child Development program at De Anza through word of mouth or college catalog or schedule of classes, compared to the Spring 2015 survey 65% (128) of students. (Question 22)
- 82% (123) of students responded excellent/very good when asked to rate the classes they have taken at De Anza College Child Development Department, while 18% (27) responded fair/below average. (Question 23)
- 95% (143) of students responded strongly agree/agree when asked if the CD courses at De Anza College prepare them with the knowledge and practices appropriate for teaching all young children, 5% (8) responded disagree/strongly disagree. (Question 25)
- 49% (73) of students responded very useful/useful when asked if they attended the Child Development Student Orientation and how useful it was to them, while 4% (6) responded not useful/not very useful and 47% (70) responded they did not attend. (Question 27)

- 89% (133) of students responded very much/somewhat when asked how much has their experience in CD at De Anza College prepared them to evaluate the development of young children, while 10% (15) responded not very much/not at all. (Question 29)
- 89% (133) of students responded very much/somewhat when asked how much has their experience in CD at De Anza College help them adapt ideas and methods to new situations in early childhood settings, while 7% (10) responded not very much/not at all. (Question 33)
- 82% (124) of students responded very much/somewhat when asked how much had their experience in CD at De Anza College prepare them to adjust their curriculum to address children needs in early childhood settings, while 7% (11) responded not very much/not at all. (Question 37)


















