Khanna	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ In the light of her recent participation in an accreditation visit, Anu has recommended that we develop a worksheet to serve as evidence of dialogue for our liaisons. This would be included in the document that we sign off for PGA credit.</li> <li>▪ Other suggestions include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Developing a campus-wide template for keeping minutes as evidence of dialogue <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ This suggestion faced objections during our meeting from both Christina and Rowena, who argue that we should not further formalize/complicate meetings on campus</li> </ul> </li> <li>▪ Clear rubrics for assessing random samples of PLOACs/SLOACs <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ These should be ready to present at the fall Opening Day workshop</li> </ul> </li> <li>▪ Document any and all changes in criteria for cycle completion</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	
Looking Ahead: The 2017 ACCJC visit	D	All	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ As we draw nearer to a self-study year, we should begin taking any measures available to prepare to demonstrate sustainability in assessment. Some considerations may include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ The status of AUO assessment <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ It was pointed out that summer is the best time to address AUO assessment, as this is typically the least demanding time of the year for administrators</li> </ul> </li> <li>▪ The inclusion of an adjunct faculty member on the Core Team <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Christina pointed out that this faces problems in the form of recent to changes to laws about adjunct work (timesheet requirements, etc.)</li> <li>▪ It <i>could</i> work if we had well-defined hours and meetings for record-keeping purposes.</li> <li>▪ The committee resolved to wait and see if any adjunct faculty express interest in this type of participation, rather than recruiting a prospective candidate</li> </ul> </li> </ul> </li> <li>▪ Christina requests a report indicating areas that are delinquent in assessment work</li> <li>▪ Tono will coordinate a 2015-16 taskforce to focus on authentic assessment work.</li> </ul>
