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Subject: LinC Survey, Spring 2014

A survey of LinC program students was conducted at the end of the Spring quarter in 2014. The survey was distributed to all students enrolled in a LinC course which resulted in 72 valid respondents. All sections of the LinC program were given the opportunity to participate in the survey.

The sections that chose to participate include:

Important Highlights Include:

- 94% of respondents reported they would recommend the learning community to a friend or family member.
- 85% of respondents described the quality of their relationships with teachers in the learning community as “friendly, supportive, and helpful.”
- 83% of respondents stated they worked with classmates during class “very often” or “often.”
- 65% of respondents stated they agree “very much” or “much” with the statement that their writing is more effective and clear after their experience in the learning community.
- 63% of respondents stated they “very often” or “often” connected and integrated ideas, concepts or skills from different classes in the learning community when discussing material and doing assignments.

- 31% of respondents reported they found out about the learning community from their teacher, 21% were recommended it by a friend, 19% saw it on the online schedule of classes, 14% were told by someone who came to class, 11% were told by a counselor, and 4% found out about it because the title or topic interested them.
