**Subject:** Transfers to Four-Year Institution, 2020-21

#### Overview:

This report reflect data for De Anza College students who transferred to the University of California (UC), California State University (CSU), in-state private or out-of-state institutions between 2016-17 and 2020-21.

## Methodology:

All transfer data were externally sourced from the websites listed below.

### **Summary:**

### Transfer by Institution Type

- In 2020-21, De Anza students continued to transfer primarily to a CSU (1,612), followed by UC (978), out-of-state (184) and in-state private (48) institutions.
- When compared to the previous year, transfer headcounts increased to the CSU and UC but decreased to out-of-state and in-state private institutions: CSU (14%), UC (8%), out-of-state (-6%) and in-state private (-16%). Overall, total transfers increased by 255 or 10%.

### **UC** Transfer

- The UC system provides data on transfer applicants, admits and enrollees. The headcounts of De Anza students who applied and were admitted increased in 2020-21 from the prior year by 7% and 7%, respectively. The admittance rate was 78% and International (84%) and Asian (78%) students had the highest admittance rates. African American students consistently have the lowest rate of UC admits. Their admittance rate in 2020-21 was 60%, a decrease from the year prior (68%).
- De Anza student' enrollment rate to the UC system in 2020-21 was 74%. Asian (78%) and white (74%) students had the highest enrollment rates, followed by African American (61%), Latinx (70%) and International (73%) students.
- San Diego (190), Berkeley (175) and Davis (157) were the top three UC destinations.

## **CSU** Transfer

- In 2020-21, the total number of CSU transfers increased by 201 from the prior year, 1,411 to 1,612. San Jose (1,078), San Francisco (153) and Cal State East Bay (130) were the top three top CSU destinations.
- Asian/Pacific Islander (41%) and Latinx (24%) students comprised the majority of De Anza students who transferred to a CSU campus.

### In-State Private and Out-of-State Transfer

- More De Anza students transferred to an out-of-state institution than an in-state private institution, 79% vs. 21%.
- The top four in-state private institutions students transferred to were Ashford University, National University, Samuel Merritt University and Santa Clara University.
- The top four out-of-state transfer destinations were Western Governors University (UT), Southern New Hampshire University (NH), Arizona State University and Grand Canyon University, both located in Arizona.

## Transfer Comparison with Neighboring Community Colleges

- Among the nine community colleges in the Foothill-De Anza, San Jose-Evergreen, San Mateo County and West Valley-Mission Community College Districts, De Anza College had the most total transfers. De Anza transfer totaled 2,822 students, followed by Foothill College (1,165) and Evergreen (875).
- When compared to the previous year, De Anza had the highest transfer count increase (+255), followed by Evergreen (+153), Mission (+52) and Skyline (+41). Transfer count decreased by 37 to 91 students for Cañada, Foothill, San Jose, San Mateo and West Valley.

## A. Transfer by Institution Type

- In 2020-21, the majority of De Anza students who transferred to a four-year institution were more likely to transfer to a CSU (1,612), followed by UC (978), out-of-state (184) and instate private (48) institution. This finding is consistent with previous years.
- Transfer headcount increased from 2019-20 to 2020-21 by 255 or 10%.


# B. University of California

#### B1. Transfer Admittance and Enrollment Headcount Trend

• The number of De Anza students who applied and were admitted to the UC system in 2020-21 was 1,677 and 1,316, respectively, and represented an increase of 7% over the prior year for both categories. A total of 978 students enrolled, an increase of 75 students (8%) from 2019-20.

De Anza College Transfer to UC System: Applicant, Admit and Enrollee Headcounts




#### B2. Transfer Admittance and Enrollment Rate

- Similar to the prior years, the admittance rate of those who applied was 78%.
- The enrollment rate of those admitted was 74%, which is similar to last year.

# De Anza College Transfer to UC System: Admittance and Enrollment Rates




## B3. Transfer Admittance and Enrollment Rate by Ethnicity

- De Anza's Asian and International students continue to comprise the majority of applicants, admits and enrollees to the UC campus. In 2020-21, they accounted for 73% of all applicants, 75% of all admits and 76% of all enrollees. For details on the admittance and enrollment of each student group by year, see <u>Appendix A</u>.
- Figure 3 provides the admittance rate by ethnicity. Consistent with prior years, International (84%) and Asian (78%) had the highest admittance rates in 2020-21. All other ethnic groups' admittance rates trailed the average rate of 78%, with the lowest rate observed for African American (60%) and Latinx (71%). Additionally, African American and Latinx's admittance rates decreased in 2020-21 from 2019-20.
- Figure 4 provides the enrollment rate by ethnicity. Asian (78%) white (74%) students had the highest enrollment rates in 2020-21. African American (61%), Latinx (70%) and International (73%) enrollment rates trailed the average rate of 74%. The enrollment rates for each ethnic group improved in 2020-21 from 2019-20.


De Anza College Transfer to UC System: Admittance Rate by Ethnicity

# B4. Transfer by Campus

• San Diego (190), Berkeley (175) and Davis (157) continued to be the top three UC destinations for De Anza students in 2020-21. Together, they accounted for 53% of all De Anza transfers to the UC system.

• Compared to the prior year, De Anza transfer headcounts increased to Los Angeles (+49), Berkeley (+32), Santa Barbara (+24), San Diego (+8), Riverside (+5) and Irvine (+1). In contrast, transfer headcount decreased to Davis (-39) and Santa Cruz (-9).

• Table 3 provides the average GPA of De Anza applicants, admits and enrollees to the UC system. Focusing on the top three UC campuses students transferred to (i.e. San Diego, Berkeley and Davis), the average GPA of enrolled students were 3.65, 3.78 and 3.55, respectively.

## C. California State University

# C1. Transfer by Campus

- In 2020-21, the total number of CSU transfers increased by 201 from the prior year, 1,411 to 1,612. As before, San Jose (1,078), San Francisco (153) and Cal State East Bay (130) were the top three top CSU destinations for De Anza students. These three campuses accounted for the largest share of De Anza transfer students (84%) to the CSU system.
- From 2019-20 to 2020-21, De Anza transfer headcounts increased to San Jose (+127), East Bay (+36), San Francisco (+18), Humboldt (+7), Stanislaus (+7), Fullerton (+6), Los Angeles (+6) and Pomona (+5). Campuses where transfer headcount decreased were Monterey Bay (-10), Sacramento (-6) and San Luis Obispo (-5).

## C2. Transfer by Ethnicity

- Asian/Pacific Islander (41%) and Latinx (24%) students comprised the majority of De Anza students who transferred to a CSU campus. This finding is consistent with previous years.
- Across all student subgroups, transfer headcount to the CSU system increased from 2019-20 to 2020-21. Asian/Pacific Islander (+101), Latinx (+52) and International (+28) had the largest headcount increases.

### D. In-State Private and Out-of-State

### D1. Transfer by Institution Type

- In 2020-21, among De Anza students who transferred to an in-state private or out-of-state institution, the majority of them opted for an out-of-state institution (79%).
- Compared to the prior year, transfer headcount to in-state private and out-of-state institutions declined in 2020-21 by 9 and 12 students, respectively. The declining trend is observed for the past five years.

## D2. Top Transfer to In-State Private and Out-of-State Institutions

The top four in-state private and out-of-state institutions De Anza students transferred to in 2020-21 is provided in Table 7.

- In-State Private: With the exception of the Samuel Merritt and Santa Clara Universities, the remaining two institutions, Ashford and National Universities, are located outside the Bay Area.
- Out-of-State: Western Governors University is primarily marketed as an online institution. Two campuses located in Arizona, Arizona State and Grand Canyon Universities, attracted a total of 26 De Anza transfer students.

### E. Transfer Comparison with Neighboring Community Colleges

This section compares the transfer headcount of community colleges in the Foothill-De Anza, San Jose-Evergreen, San Mateo County and West Valley-Mission Community College Districts.

• In 2020-21, De Anza College had the most transfer headcount, totalling 2,822 students. This finding is consistent by institution type as well, except for in-state private. Foothill College had the second highest total transfers (1,165).

• When compared to the previous year, De Anza had the highest transfer headcount increase (+255), followed by Evergreen (+153), Mission (+52) and Skyline (+41). Transfer count decreased by 37 to 91 students for Cañada, Foothill, San Jose, San Mateo and West Valley.
