<u>Course Objectives</u>: Use of basic arithmetic in application problems, estimation, the real number system, variables and linear equations, graphs of linear equations and the Cartesian coordinate system, the concept of function.

(CHAPTERS: 1,2,3,4,5,6,7,8 & 9) & Intro of Functions.

#### **Student Learning Outcomes:**

\* Demonstrate and apply a systematic and logical approach to solving arithmetic and geometric problems.

- \* Demonstrate and apply the knowledge and skills required to select the correct introductory formulas, procedures, and concepts from algebra and geometry and use them to solve problems.
- \* **Grading:** Your grade in this course will be based on 1) CW/HW, 2) QUIZZES, 3) THREE MID TERM TESTS and 4) a comprehensive FINAL EXAM. It is a POINT system.
- \* <u>ATTENDANCE</u>: Attendance is strongly emphasized. When you are absent, it is your responsibility to get the notes from other students who attend this same class. Your classmates are your great resource. CW is assigned in each class, and neat CW needs to be submitted every Monday.
- \* You are expected to attend all classes. Tardy counts as half an absence. You are considered tardy if you come to the class after teaching is started.. Also leaving the class early will count as half an absence. If you accumulate five absences you will be dropped from the class. Please inform me by email if you are going to be absent and the reason for it. YOU MUST BE IN CLASS EVERY DAY FOR THE FIRST TWO WEEKS OF CLASS OR YOU MAY BE DROPPED. Each absence(up to three) can be cleared by taking 1 hour/ for each absence (total: 3hrs) of tutoring, if you intimate me the reason prior to the absence by e-mail.. The rest will be counted.
- \* For an absence if you bring a medical or court excuse (professional letterhead is required) ON THE DAY YOU ATTEND THE CLASS, that will be recorded and will be considered and the absence will not be counted against you. **If no excused document is produced absences will be counted.**
- \* QUIZZES OR TESTS are **NOT** made up, even if it is an excused absence.

\* Homework problems are given at the end of each class. YOU NEED TO TURN IN HW PROBLEMS EVERY WEDNESDAY. It is your responsibility to do them without fail, and you are encouraged to ask questions from that HW, at the beginning of next class, if you did not understand any problems from your HW OR you can always meet me one-on-one, during my office hours, for help.

#### **GRADING**

- 1. CW Problems Check: (2 points for each CW; (20 points/ Every MONDAY) (IF IT IS VERY NEAT WORK 5 points will be added. TOTAL 25 points) Each day notes is given for each topic and class work problems are assigned to finish in the class period. At the end of that particular chapter(or chapters) you need to show that to me and get it signed by me. Each CW work (signed by me) is worth 2 points. If you are absent any day you will be given chance (for an excused absence) to show the missed CW in the next class for (not later than that) those missed 2 points.
- 2. HOME WORK Check: (2 points for each HW; (20 points/ Every Wednesday)
  (IF IT IS VERY NEAT WORK 5 points will be added. TOTAL 25 POINTS)

  HW problems are given for each topic when a topic is finished. After we finish that particular chapter you need to show HW to me and get it signed by me either on Monday or Wednesday depending upon when the chapter is finished. Each HW work (signed by me) is worth 2 points. If you are absent any day you will be given chance (for an excused absence) to show the missed HW in the next class for (not later than that) those missed 2 points.
- 3. <u>QUIZZES</u>: (10 points each; Total 100 points) 10 QUIZZES are given at the beginning or end of a class, for 15-20min. <u>Calculators are ALLOWED on the quizzes. Make-up quizzes will not be given.</u> So you can get a maximum of 100 points for all the quizzes.
- **4. MID-TERM TESTS:** (3 TIMES 100 = 300 POINTS): Three Mid term Tests are given in this quarter. See the tentative schedule below. A consideration is given when you are absent for ONE MID TERM TEST under emergency situations (proof is needed). In such cases, The final exam score will REPLACE for that one missed test. ONLY ONE TIME. You need to be present for the rest of the tests. If you are NOT absent for any test, then your final exam score will replace ONE(ONLY ONE) failing score of one test. The remaining two test scores will be counted as they are.
- 5. **FINAL EXAM:** (200 points): You *must* take the final exam to pass the course. A two-hour comprehensive exam will be given. *If you miss the final exam, you will receive an F for the course,* even if you are passing before final exam. Students may bring 1 page of formulas to the final. Finals must be taken at scheduled time during finals week.
