Quizzes: You have three attempts for each quiz. No late attempts allowed, so start at least one day before the due date. Canvas will drop the lowest four quiz scores. If you have a question about your score, see me after class so that we can look at your responses together.

Group work: THESE MUST BE HANDWRITTEN on paper by each person INDIVIDUALLY. You may talk with anyone about it and share ideas; however, if I find that you are copying word for word without thinking on your own, I will not be pleased. Canvas will drop the lowest two scores.

Exams: There will be 3 midterm exams and a final exam during the quarter given on Canvas. Your lowest exam score will be dropped.

Labs: We will have three labs which may be submitted AS A GROUP. Computer labs can be done in groups of no more than four people for a common grade and be turned in by the due date.
