Qualifying score on the English as a Second Language placement test or English as a Second Language 234 with a grade of C or better.

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Development of English speaking, listening, reading and writing skills with an emphasis on explicit, direct grammar instruction. Vocabulary-building and writing are emphasized. Pronunciation practice and discussion of cross-cultural topics are also included.

COURSE OBJECTIVES:

- 1 Comprehend, analyze and respond to reading and listening intermediate materials.
- 2 Write a group of topic-related sentences using level specific grammar and vocabulary.
- 3 Demonstrate understanding and usage of level-specific grammar and vocabulary in reading, writing, listening and speaking.

GRADING CRITERIA: Grading will be based on completion of homework assignments, participation in class activities, midterm quizzes, and the final exam.

• **Class Participation/Completion of Tasks.....60%**

Since improvement in conversation largely depends on practice, your attendance in class and completion of in-class and homework assignments is of the utmost importance.
