#### STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES:


By the end of the course students will be able to:

- 2. Identify ethical issues in a business law context and evaluate factually simple contract issues using basic common law or UCC rules.







- <u>Legal Case Studies:</u> Discussion essay questions will be posted at Canvas each week. Mid-term #1 covers materials from chapters 1, 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7. Mid-term #2 covers materials from chapters 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 16, and 17. Exams will be posted in Canvas on the exam date shown below. You have to submit your answers before deadline. NO credit will be given for late submissions. Mid-term Exams are counted as 40% to your final grade.
- Final Exam: There will be one *open-book, close-note* final exam remotely proctored by Proctorio at the end of the Summer session. Final exam covers materials from chapters 25, 26, 28, 29, 32, and 33. Exams will be posted in Canvas on the exam date shown below. You have to submit your answers before deadline. NO credit will be given for late submissions. Students who missed the exams will not be allowed to take make-up tests. Final Exam is counted as 20% to your final grade.
