
VRC Office's Winter Break Schedule

Scholarship for Veterans

Amount: \$1,000

Students who are military veterans can submit a short essay to apply for this scholarship.

This program is funded by the nonprofit [Scholarship for Veterans](#) organization and employees of the Foothill-De Anza Community College District.

- Up to **three students a year** may qualify for an award of \$1,000 each.

Rotary/Uenaka Scholarship

Amount: \$1,500

- This scholarship is open to all workforce training majors but **veterans will be given preference**.

RESEARCH STUDY: CALL FOR PARTICIPANTS

6 to 12 Participants Needed!

For a research study exploring the lived experiences of wives of U.S. male combat veterans and access to supportive mental health services.

Eligibility:

- You speak and understand English proficiently.
- You live in an urban area in Northern California.
- You identify as a female.
- You identify as a wife.
- You are married to a U.S. male combat veteran with PTSD.
- You tried to access supportive mental health services.
- You are in the age range 24 to 64.

Participation includes:

- 5-to-10 minutes: Pre-screening questionnaire.
- 5-to-10 minutes: Complete consent form.
- 30-to-60-minutes: Zoom interview auto recorded.
- 5-to-10 minutes: Review interview transcript via email.
- \$50 Visa gift card: For completion of all study requirements.

If you know anyone who is married to an U.S. male combat veteran with PTSD, please share this flyer with them.

More about this study...

Research approval: This research has been approved and certified as ethnically sound by the Institutional Review Board of National University.

Participant safety: The semi-structured interview method chosen for this study involves low risk of trauma. Participants will be asked to discuss their lived experiences related to accessing supportive mental health services and being married to a U.S. male combat veteran with PTSD.

Confidentiality: The names and places associated with this study will be replaced with pseudonyms and non-identifying descriptions.
